Dr. Ming-Jen Chen, born in 1967, is a senior clinical staff in division of Gastroenterology, Mackay Memorial Hospital, Taipei and a clinical associated profession at Mackay Medical College. He was graduated from China Medicine College in 1992. Dr. Chen gained a medical master degree from Post Graduate Institute of Medicine, Taipei Medical University in 2006. His work and thesis under the supervision of Prof. Chen is "Caffeic acid phenethyl ester induces apoptosis of human pancreatic cancer cells involving caspase and mitochondrial dysfunction" and "Caffeic acid phenethyl ester inhibits Epithelial- Mesenchymal Transition of human pancreatic cancer cells". He had established a phenotype and epidemiology data of follicular gastritis in H. pylori infection and analyzed the correlation between "Endoscopic patterns and histopathologic features after eradication therapy in Helicobacter pylori-associated follicular gastritis". Especially, he is interested in the specialized skills in



diagnosis and treatment of GI cancers such as endoscopic submucosal dissection. He was trained as trainee at National Cancer Center Hospital, Tokyo, Japan (2008. Dec-2009. Feb and 2011. Aug) and he was a trainers in World Gastroenterology Organisation; 2013 Train the Trainers Workshop, Portugal 2013. He became a faculty of World Gastroenterology Organisation; 2015 Train the Trainers Workshop, Taipei 2015. Dr Chen also established several artificial, ex vivo and animal model for the training of advanced endoscopic procedures. Over the last 19 years, he has focused his scientific interests on the topics related to GI mucosal lesion and inflammation, Helicobacter pylori, esophageal cancer and gastric cancer, epithelial mesenchymal transition (EMT), peritoneal carcinomatosis, total parenteral nutrition and evidence based medicine. He had one patent about ESD training in Taiwan and he almost had 80 publicatons in his name.
